Council on Education & Health Workforce Recommendation to ISMS Board on
01/28/2023

This resolution calls for the Illinois delegation to the AMA to submit a resolution directing the AMA to encourage medical residency programs to create a pathway for resident physicians interested in healthcare leadership to undergo master's in business administration (MBA with the focus on healthcare administration) training, in order to increase physician led healthcare systems.

The Council supported the goal of the resolution and focused particularly on the importance of broadening the scope of the resolution beyond just encouraging physicians to pursue MBA programs, as there are other ways to support or promote healthcare leadership. The Council agreed to recommend an amended resolution.

The Council on Education & Health Workforce recommends that the ISMS Board of Trustees adopt Resolution 12.2022-37 (A-23), as amended:

RESOLVED, that the Illinois delegation to the AMA submit a resolution directing the AMA to encourage ~~medical residency programs to create a pathway for resident physicians interested in healthcare leadership to undergo master's in business administration (MBA with the focus on healthcare administration) training education~~ for medical trainees in healthcare leadership, which may include additional degrees at the master's level and/or certificate programs, in order to increase physician-led healthcare systems.
