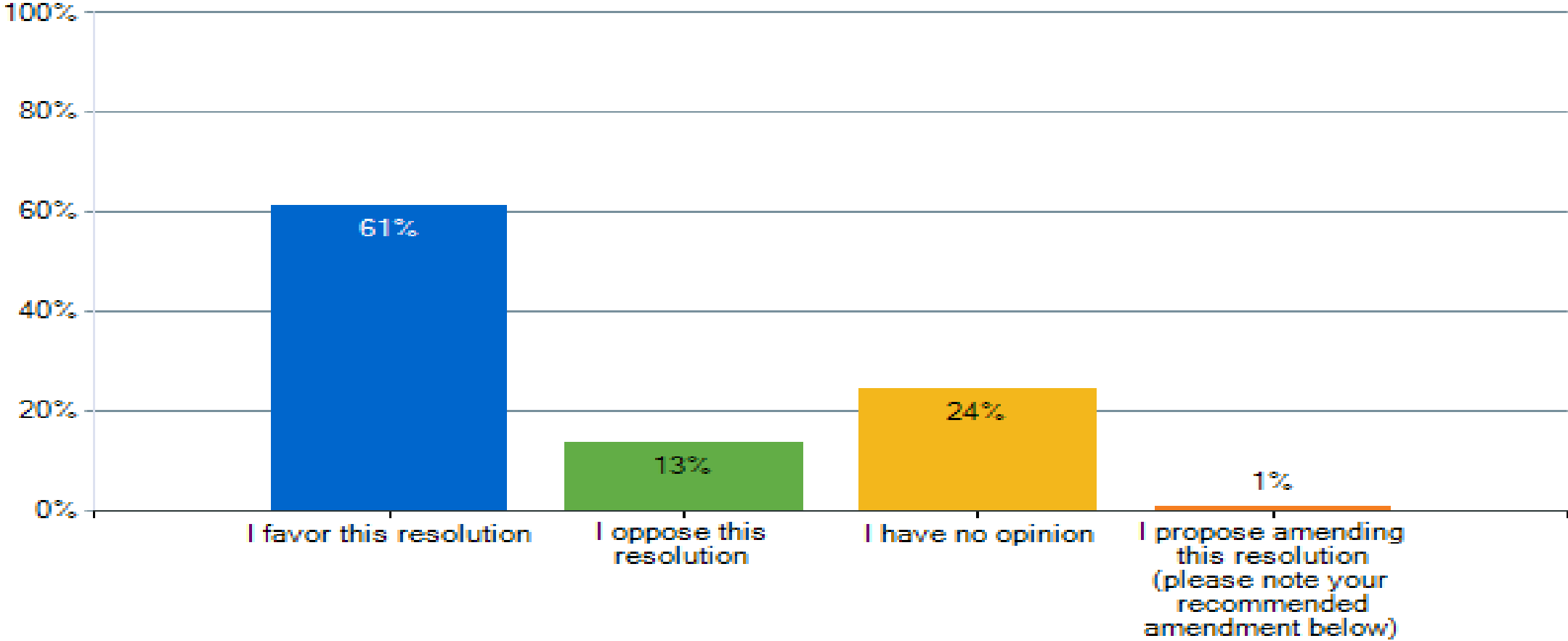
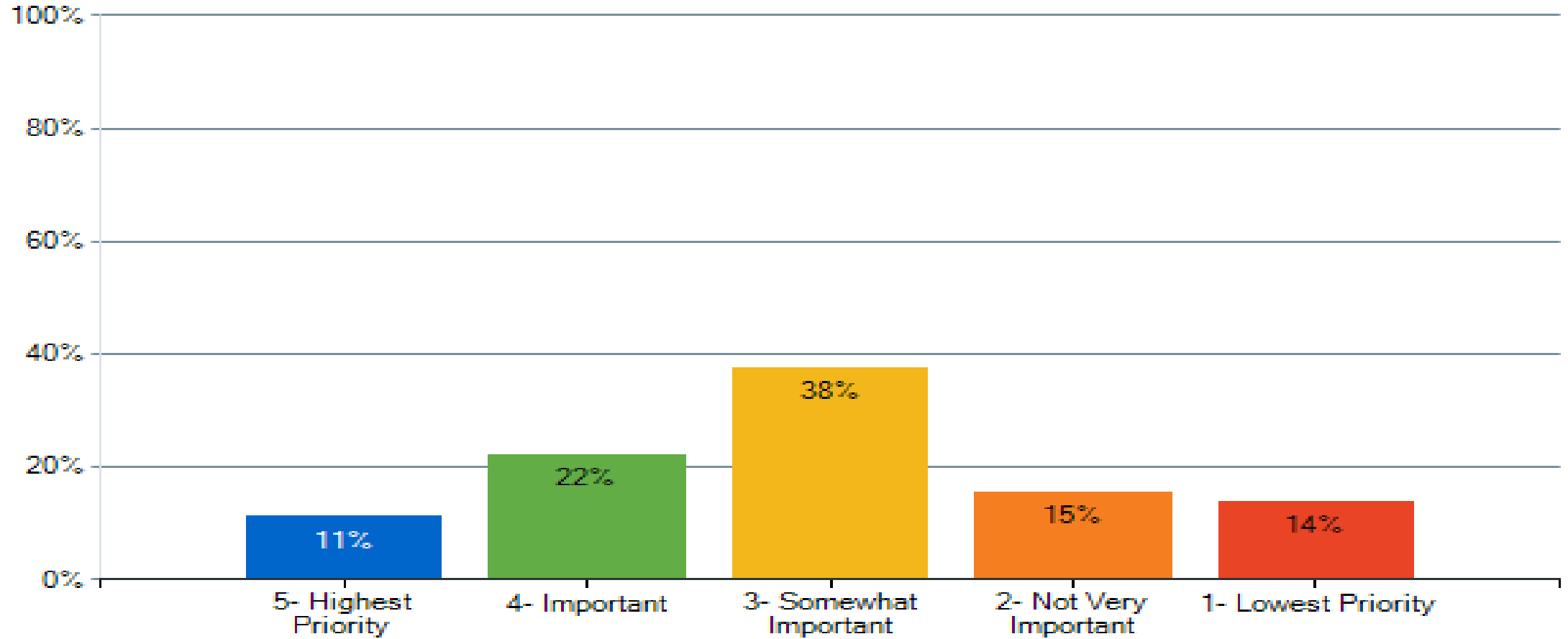


Reducing the Financial Burden of Visiting Rotations for Medical Students

Response Text

There should be earlier acceptance schedule for specialties that have earlier matches.

Students should recognize that providing training for students comes with significant time commitment and usually is reimbursed much less than clinical care. By reducing fees, there is a chance you could end up reducing sites willing to sponsor students.

This is a tough one. Of course, I agree that student fees and charges for these rotations should be minimal to non-existent. But I do not see that the ISMS should have any effective negotiating power about this subject. I suppose there is no cost for us to have a published opinion which is directed to the deans of Illinois medical schools.

I am not sure what is a "visiting student rotation."

Language could be more fine-tuned, but good topic that should be addressed for our students and future physicians.

It is very reasonable that any extra fees for examples can and should be covered by the exorbitant tuition paid by medical students while decreasing profits and excessive salary increases for university officials.
